

POULSHOT VILLAGE TRUST PONDS PROJECT UPDATE REPORT

MIDDLE GREEN POND

The pond on the Green has the rare Great Crested Newt. They leave the pond in the Autumn to hibernate and will return in the Spring to breed.

Maintenance work was undertaken on 16th November to clear and tidy the pond, by manually removing the overgrown weeds, reeds and rushes, while the newts are out of the pond hibernating. Continued effort was made to control the growth of the invasive New Zealand Pygmyweed, to prevent further spread of the plant.

Fourteen motivated and dedicated volunteers from the Village Trust, helped and supported all aspects of the maintenance work to achieve our goals. A big thank you to all the volunteers.

The pond looks very much improved, with evidence of reduced presence of the invasive plant and will provide significant benefits to wildlife and enhance the enjoyment of the whole environment.

A special thank you to Caroline Morison for kindly providing sustenance of hot delicious soups and French bread for the working party – very much appreciated.

Annual maintenance work will be undertaken in November 2020.

Maureen's Ramblings.....

Is winter getting to your spirit? What?? Well, does your relationship with God feel a bit cold? Do you feel frosty towards God because of bad things happening? Have you lost hope that the springtime of God's blessing will ever touch your life again? Does any faith you have had in the past feel frozen and unlikely ever to come to life again? I think we all have winter times of faith.

"Mother Teresa's Crisis of Faith" was the title of a magazine article which discussed the private spiritual struggles of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, revealed in letters published after her death. How could this iconic woman of faith have experienced such spiritual desolation and doubt? She had written: "September 1959...in my soul I feel a terrible pain of loss. I have little hope of possessing God; I have the feelings of God not wanting me; of God not being God; of God not really existing... darkness surrounds me on all sides and I can't lift my soul to God. In my heart there is no faith, no love, no trust. I want God with all the powers of my soul and yet there is between us this terrible separation". These are certainly winter feelings, feelings we can all know sometimes.

One winter morning I awoke to see magnificent lines of frost stretching across my windowpanes, shining in the early morning winter sunshine. They looked like little miracles that had been formed in the dark of the night. In reflection I thought of how life is so like that. We live out many of our days in the shadows, in what often feels like barren, cold winter, unaware of the miracles that are being created in our spirits through those cold nights. It takes the sudden daylight, some unexpected surprise of life, to cause our gaze to look upon a simple, stunning growth that has happened quietly inside us. Like frost designs on a winter window, they bring us beyond life's fragmentation and remind us that we are not nearly as lost as we thought we were, that all the time we thought we were dead inside, beautiful things were being born in us. Goethe wrote that sometimes our fate resembles a fruit tree in winter. Who would think that those branches would turn green again and blossom, but we hope it, we know it. Or, in the words of that lovely Easter hymn, written by John M. C. Crum, that we will sing when winter is over, when our hearts are saddened, grieving or in pain, by your touch you call us back to life again; fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been: Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green. As winter continues for a while -hang on in there! Spring is coming! There is Resurrection! And God has never been far away. May he bless you in 2020 with a thawing and warming of your spirit!

This includes the Armed Forces personnel from many countries who gave their lives, and those who returned home injured in body and mind; the hard-working women and men who kept the factories, mines, shipyards and farms operating throughout the years of turmoil; the ARP wardens, police officers, doctors, nurses, firemen, local defence volunteers and many others who put their lives on hold to safeguard the home front. 


